 - Strategic Enrollment Management (SEM) Kickoff Retreat 12-5 p.m. Darr (Several COB folks were nominated for the Committee and councils) - Sept. 18th

Course Credit for Supervising Internships With internship participation rates expected to increase, guidelines are needed to ensure there is equity in how internship sections are staffed and credited toward faculty workloads. Dave will have draft guidelines ready to review prior to the next CLT meeting.
- iv. Faculty and Staff Travel Monies & Student Organization Support (handout) Let Dave or Stef know if numbers are off on the spreadsheet. COB funds travel via carry-forward funds, which are not available until late September. Discussed increasing travel allotments per department. Dave will update and distribute.
- v. BOG Retreat Highlights A recent marketing study indicated that "Business" is one of MSU's best-known programs by current and prospective students, HS counselors, and alumni. The marketing consultants recommended MSU leverage this strength, and possibly one or two others, to promote the quality of the institution (Halo Effect If COB is really good, other programs must likewise be very good). MSU Communications may leverage this strength, as well as one or two other colleges/programs, going forward. Clif and Frank both talked about recruiting and retention (Primary focus for both AC and ALC retreats). The Foundation set a record for fundraising in FY19, and is gearing up for the upcoming Capital Campaign.
