- a. Dr. Ragan
 - i. Major Equipment Funding Requests due to Dr. Ragan September 28, 2018
 - ii. IMA 2018 Accounting Education Conference faculty need to submit lists of students attending to Dr. Olen Greer by September 18th.
 - iii. Building Renovations: We are still looking for naming opportunities for various classrooms.
 - a) Large classrooms on first floor (101,102 and 108) are in need of new chairs. Tables can accommodate 140, currently there are 120. Architects are reviewing feasibility. CLT agreed to increase seating if feasible.
 - b) We are also looking to increase capacity in computer lab in 467.
 - c) 434 will have the ceiling lowered and duct work spread out to improve air conditioning issues.

Departmental Updates:

BAC: Student success learning institute put on by Complete College American and two representative from BAC will participate to look at strategies to assist 1st generation and minority college students. BAC is doing peer advising with students on probation and it has been well-received. Admitting students to degree programs – 615 need to be admitted to business unit, 87 to China campus and 50 in TCM.

MKT: Ollis is going to set up an internship. Federated Insurance is beginning to work with Sales students. Recruiting is being done to replace Melissa Burnett who will be retiring next semester.

MARCOM: 140 employers are slated for Career Fair, more than are listed in the guide as some entries were past the deadline. About 800 students are eligible to attend. 37 employers for SOA with 211 students participated. Corporate Mentor program is kicking off with student orientation tonight. September 27 is the employer orientation followed by a reception.

SOA: Carl Keller is in the hospital since Sunday evening. George Schmelze injured his back. Implemented block scheduling on the MAcc program. There are some issues with the block scheduling with students on the GI bill which is being investigated.

MIT: Working on curriculum – done with IT and now on Management and Entrepreneurship. We are doing a mixer prior to career fair - we currently have 40 representatives from 20 employers participating.

TCM: Position for Construction management faculty is posted.

FGB: Mixer for insurance companies planned prior to career fair sponsored by Gamma lota Sigma. Heather's replacement will be in place by October 1. Dean Meinert and Jeff Jones are attending Junior Achievement event at Hickory Hills Country Club tonight to explore opportunities for participation.
