I. Dean's Agenda Items

b. Discussion:

- i. Computer Science & MSU Math Admission Requirements DESE previously required MO high school students to complete three math courses, but now will allow students to substitute a computer science course for one math course.
 - a) MSU has historically, and continues to require three math courses for admission.
 - b) Given the new graduation requirements, going forward some prospective MSU students will not satisfy the three-math course requirement. Deans were polled recently regarding their thoughts on whether MSU should consider revising the three-math course requirement. Deans were not supportive of the change.
 - c) To ensure students have sufficient math backgrounds for ACC, FIN, QBA, etc. courses, CLT unanimously agreed MSU should keep the three-math course admission requirement.

- iii. Dean Search Update Skype interviewed two candidates and there are two more tomorrow then they will decide on on-site interviews.
- iv. Update on Mission Diploma Former students, who are close to completion, have been identified and will be contacted. A committee is reviewing transcripts on the Thursday before fall break to discuss course substitutions, waivers etc. in an effort to encourage these students to complete their degrees. Sandy Culver will be the coordinator for COB and will contacting DHs as needed.

- vi. Postings for Tenure Track Open Rank positions (Chris & Helen)
 - a) A committee is exploring whether it will be possible to open a single search for multiple, tenure track ranks.
 - b) This change would eliminate the need to have a separate posting for each advertised rank
- vii. Department level Alumni communications and engagement Dean will send a follow-up email to DHs to compile information for our EAC meeting.
- viii. Skybox for October 27th football game COB has two skyboxes to fill let Dean know if you have some advisory members you would like to invite.
- ix. Commencement Attendance one per year notifications will be sent to all faculty with a calendar invite as well as for the New Student Convocation to encourage participation. Dean will encourage and DHs will reinforce.

Curriculum changes in the works: changes in the Finance Major, development of two options in the RMI major: 1) Insurance and 2) Enterprise Risk Management, as well as a graduate certificate in Risk Management. In the Insurance track, they would like to include MKT 351 and MKT 352 to add selling to the major list as an elective. Affecting MIT – in the graduate certificate for Enterprise Risk Management they would like to include two cybersecurity classes in the list of choice. Risk Management and Insurance minor will be converted to two minors: Insurance Minor and Enterprise Risk Management Minor.
